Selection process:

The awardee will be selected based on the following aspects:

- Scientific merit
- Method and design
- Inclusion of cultural aspects
- Quality of presentation
- Time management

Final selection will be during the annual meeting.

Eligible to apply:

- Medical students
- Psychiatry residents and fellows
- Doctorate students
- Junior faculty and early career psychiatrists
- Students of other mental health disciplines
- Must be Hispanic/Latino or work with Hispanic/Latino populations
- Work from various authors must identify one applicant

Requirements:

- One-page biographical sketch
- Updated CV
- Title of research project
- Abstract (composed of 3 parts)
 - 3 learning objectives
 - Narrative of maximum 500 words
 - 3 bibliographic references

Areas:

- Molecular, Translational, and Neuroscience Research
- Clinical Psychobiology
- Treatment including Psychopharmacology, Psychotherapy, and Neural Strategies
- Alcohol, Pain, and Drug Abuse Research
- Health Disparities and Health Services Research
- Innovative Community Programs to improve Hispanic/Latino Mental Health.
